


Woodside School

Forest School









It has been a busy half term at Forest School!

Our Nursery children have had lots of fun finding hidden animals, using their initiative to work out how to rescue them from difficult to reach hiding places. Reception children have been very interested in the squirrel nest which blew down in the storm and have worked together to create a giant nest of their own, thinking about the materials they needed to make it strong and cosy. Year 4 children were fascinated by the fungi growing in Forest School, identifying several different varieties, learning about their habitat and what they can be used for, and taking photos to monitor how they changed over time. The children have also enjoyed working together to make dens, bug-hunting, 'cooking' in the mud kitchen, and creating clay reindeers and natural Christmas decorations to decorate our trees.
